# Creating a Community of Care and Prevention

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month and National Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Since 2007, churches in the South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church have sought to provide and implement Safe Sanctuary practices for the protection of children, youth, vulnerable adults and volunteers. The UMC requires each church to be Safe Sanctuary certified. Each local church must maintain a Safe Sanctuary policy and review it annually.

Open Hearts UMC will host our first Safe Sanctuary training on April 14th at 12:15 in Trinity Hall following morning worship. Congregants who volunteer with children, youth and vulnerable adults are required to participate in Safe Sanctuary training, but <u>everyone</u> in the congregation is encouraged to attend. Your participation in this training shows a commitment to having open hearts for victims and proactively providing a safe environment for everyone to grow their faith.

If you are unable to attend on this date, please contact Sarah Moseley to discuss alternate options to procure this training.

April is also a perfect time to help the Julie Valentine Center (JVC) support child abuse and sexual assault survivors. During the month of April, Open Hearts would like to collect the following for JVC:



- New T-shirts, lightweight pants, shorts, socks and women's underwear in sizes from small to 3X for those who go to the hospital and have their clothes taken as evidence. Choose loose and comfortable items.
- Individually wrapped snacks (pretzels, goldfish crackers, graham cracker cookies, fruit chews, baked chips, candy, cookies, chewy granola bars, nutritious bars, trail mix, etc.)
- Juice boxes, bottled water
- Hygiene supplies (small bars of soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes)

Salkehatchie Summer Service is a United Methodist Church servant ministry throughout locations in South Carolina where youth (ages 14 & up) and adults come together to serve the community. For a whole week, these volunteers work on homes within the community that need



improvement. These projects include painting walls, repairing leaky roofs, repairing broken windows and doors, rebuilding bathrooms, rebuilding porches, stabilizing floors and walls, and more. Each summer over 200 families in South Carolina are served by volunteers across the state to bring life-changing improvements to their homes.

This year we hope to send a group of youth and adults from Open Hearts to the Newberry Salkehatchie camp, July 14th-19th.
