With one year behind us, we now take the time to look ahead at what the next year may look like for us with the same joy and expectation we had in our first year.

Transitioning our Committees

We have a Leadership Team made up of 11 laity and myself. We have met at least two hours every month since our inception. I commend the commitment of this team, the trust they built, and their contributions that allowed the church to thrive in our first year. Their last charge is to create a Vision Statement for the new governing body. The Nominations and Leadership Development Committee is currently working to fill all administrative and ministry committees using the Book of Discipline requirements and suggestions. Once these committees and roles are filled, and the Leadership Team delivers our Vision Statement, we will dissolve the Leadership Team so that the new governing structure can assume responsibilities. We give thanks for all that the Leadership Team has done to help us start and nurture this new church plant.

Chartering Goals

As a new church start, we are a ministry of the SC Annual Conference of the UMC under Congregational Development. We are not our own chartered church or legal entity. This has presented some challenges for us. Though none have been too overwhelming, there have been challenges, nonetheless. As a new church start, we also receive generous financial support from different offices of the Annual Conference. Typically, a new church is given five years to wean off conference financial support. Then the congregation is given another two years before it is asked for any apportionment payments. We have been incredibly blessed by the generosity of our membership and friends at OHUMC. You can see from our Stewardship Quarterly that we are a growing, healthy congregation, and I do not see any reason why we should wait the full five years before chartering. We have received much financial support from the Annual Conference. Considering our health, I would like to release those funds for some other new church plant that may have greater needs than us.

Thus I would like for us as a church to prayerfully consider chartering by the next Annual Conference meeting, which will be June 2025. Chartering will allow us to become our own entity, will simplify business management, and will grant us lay delegate voices at Annual Conference proceedings. I hope that after seeing a full calendar year of giving, a fully operational committee structure, a vision statement, and necessary policies in place, we can request a constituting charge conference with our District Superintendent early in 2025.

Please pray for our path forward and for all our lay servants who are leading us there. May God continue to richly bless Open Hearts UMC!

Celebrating Stewardship APRIL - JUNE 2024

PRAYERS

Over 80 prayer requests received and lifted up.

- 87 cards mailed to people on our prayer list.
- 11 letters of encouragement sent to our college students, and 6 cards sent to graduates.
- 12 art projects by OHUMC children mailed to homebound members.

15 soup deliveries to people on our prayer list.

PRESENCE

- 42 children attended Vacation Bible School.
- 29 women attended the April Women's Ministry Dinner.
- 22 men attended the first Men's Ministry Dinner in June.
- On an average Sunday, we have present 91 disciples in Sunday
- School, **132 in-person** worshippers, and **52 online** worshippers. **14 children and adults** toured Samaritan House.

\$8,723.25 raised for the Samaritan House 20-for-20 campaign, including \$147.25 raised by the Vacation Bible School kids.


SERVICE

- 12 Blessing Bags made for the homeless by the Children's Sunday School class.

WITNESS

74 children, parents, and staff enjoyed the meals we sponsored on the 1st day of school at the CDC under its new operator, Augusta Road Baptist Church.
18 individuals donated blood, saving up to 54 lives through The Blood Connection.



- 66 people completed Safe Sanctuary training to make OHUMC safer.
- 24 girls at Girl Up received Bibles and dinner with their families from the Open Hearts Sunday School class.

Nancy Tucker is a retired 1st grade teacher with a heart for children. She joins from a closed UMC.


Henry Tucker resides in California and joins from a closed UMC is Greenville.


KICKOFF DINNER
