PRAYERS

CARES started a **new soup ministry** delivered to members recovering from illness or surgery. We also continue with our **prayer chain** ministry, **card ministry**, and **visitations**. Because we are called to **pray ceaselessly**, it can be difficult to quantify this discipleship practice, but you can hear more about our CARES ministry on the back of this report.



PRESENCE

- **71 women** attended the Women's Ministry Fall Kickoff Dinner.
- 25 women attending the Fall Women's Bible Study.
- **19 men** attended the Men's Ministry Dinner in August.
- 9 families, including 14 children, attended the Family Zoo Outing.
- **100 people** attended the Back to School dinner.
- **58 seats** at the table were filled for our Break Bread Together meals.
- On an average Sunday, we have present **95 disciples** in Sunday School, **139 in-person** worshippers, and **57 online** worshippers.



GIFTS

- **\$165,689.43** in tithes, gifts, and offerings given to God through Open Hearts UMC, which is an **8.2% increase** from last quarter.
- **5 new choristers** joined the adult choir to share their gifts in worship.
- **382 hours** from volunteers who shared their gifts for our music ministry.



SERVICE

- **7 servants** spent **6 days** at Salkehatchie repairing **2 homes** in Newberry.
- **50 backpacks** filled with school supplies were donated to Southside High School.
- **167 items** were given to the teachers at Grove and Thomas Kerns Elementary Schools.
- 9 people packed approximately 1600 meals for Meals on Wheels.
- 17 people served as hosts to our 9 Break Bread Together meals in September.



WITNESS

- **8 individuals** delivered cold treats to the Salkehatchie team and home owners at the Newberry work site.
- **16 individuals** donated blood, saving up to **48 lives** through The Blood Connection.
- **6 youth** led the congregation in a powerful worship Youth Sunday service and gave witness to their work at Salkehatchie.
- **20,300 people reached** on Facebook, which is **141% increase** from last quarter, and **1054 new visitors** to our website.



At Open Hearts United Methodist Church, **stewardship is discipleship**. When you give to God your **prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness,** you live into the call of being a disciple of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.
