PRAYERS

- 13 soup deliveries for people on our prayer list who were sick.
- 90 hours of prayer and volunteering by our CARES team.
- **36 Christmas cards** written to men incarcerated on South Carolina's death row by the New Adult Sunday School class.
- 37 cards and welcome emails sent to frequent visitors and 78 birthday cards sent to members.

PRESENCE



- 16 children participate in our new Sunday Bible School program, 9 participants on our online Advent Bible Study, 16 youth participating in their new Bible Study, and 30 women in the Fall Women's Bible Study.
- 35 participants at our first Young Adult Christmas party.
- 110 participants at our Advent Family Dinner.
- On an average Sunday, we have present **85 disciples** in Sunday School, **149 in-person** worshippers, and **63 online** worshippers.

GIFTS

- \$1,010 contributed to United Ministries by Sunday School classes for their ministries.
- \$1,900 contributed by the Open Hearts Sunday School class to charities.
- **\$3,830** in Advent offerings to be distributed to United Methodist agencies and charities.
- **\$260,882.55** in tithes, gifts, and offerings given to God through Open Hearts UMC, which is a **60% increase** from last quarter.

Our choir has grown to 20 members who share their musical gifts in worship.



SERVICE

- 43 winter coats and approximately 400 Thanksgiving food items were donated for Alexander Elementary School students in need.
- 7 volunteers served at United Ministries Winter Wonderland.
- **9 volunteers** prepared and/or served lunch for 16 Triune Mercy Center staff and served lunch on a different day to 70+ community members experiencing homelessness at TMC.
- 770 hours from volunteers serving in music ministry and 84 hours from volunteers serving in audio/visual ministry.



WITNESS

- 4 individuals gave their testimony at our Moravian Love Feast worship service.
- 14 individuals donated blood, saving up to 42 lives through The Blood Connection.
- 21,400 people reached on Facebook, which is 5.8 % increase from last quarter, and 1217 new visitors to our website, which is a 16% increase.
- **308 worshippers** chose to celebrate Christmas Eve with us at Open Hearts, including **18 children** who sang an anthem during the Family-Friendly service.

Jasmine Road

In 2016 Jasmine Road, a twoyear residential program for women survivors of sex trafficking, prostitution, and addiction, opened in Greenville. Jasmine Road offers a loving community to promote healing, empowerment, and ultimately, thriving through sustainable employment, safe



housing, opportunities for personal and educational development, and long-term support.

Jasmine Road's social enterprise program allows participants opportunities to be employed in making candles, creating jewelry, and working in the restaurant Jasmine Kitchen at 503 Augusta Street. Through the social enterprise program participants learn skills in customer service, marketing, management, teamwork, and accountability while providing services that benefit the Greenville community.

To support this worthy enterprise, the S.H.A.R.E. Committee encourages our church family to enjoy a delicious and healthy lunch of soups, salads, and sandwiches at Jasmine Kitchen at 503 Augusta Street from February 17–28, Monday through Friday, 11:30–2:30 with Open Hearts friends or folks you want to get to know better. 
