MUSIC HAPPENINGS



Beautiful, worshipful music offered to God at a high level of excellence is a primary draw for many folks as they select a particular church to attend on a regular basis. More importantly, we serve a perfect God and our musical excellence honors Him. We are fortunate to have an excellent music program with wonderful singers and instrumentalists who regularly grace us with their talents. Our Schantz organ is a beautiful instrument that is admired by everyone who has played or heard it. However, two years ago we learned that it requires an overhaul to refurbish all the general pistons which are currently non-functional. General pistons control the entire organ's stops and couplers. In order to play it at this time, organists have to manually control each divisional stop independently, which makes the instrument very difficult to play well. General pistons allow for fast changes across all divisions, but our organ has lost this capability. To refurbish it properly we have consulted both local and regional experts who have assessed the cost estimate to be \$120,000. We appreciate the congregation's help in raising this money through the organ fund. Please indicate your support of this ministry with "Organ fund" on the memo line of your check. Moreover, they shared their personal stories of how they became involved with Pendleton Place, enthralled us with a harrowing story of helping hungry teenagers in buildings without electricity in the midst of Hurricane Helene, lifted our hearts in celebrating the educational successes of their clients, and answered an array of questions. Participants not only gained insight into an issue that most knew little about but also enjoyed fellowship over bowls of ice cream sundaes.
