MUSIC HAPPENINGS



Mental health is essential for overall well-being at every stage of life. Regardless of age, background, or experience, prioritizing mental health strengthens individuals, families, and communities.


In September as part of our efforts to build a loving and inclusive church and to be disciples of Jesus in expressing compassion to those suffering and marginalized, S.H.A.R.E. will be bringing the congregation information through our newsletter, bulletin inserts, flyers posted on church bulletin boards, and social media posts. Throughout this period we will be sharing how to promote mental health awareness for all ages, guidance on helping a person with mental illness, and use of sensitive language in discussing mental health, drawing upon resources from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration and the National Alliance for Mental Illness.

Fall Kickoff Dinner


Our Fall Kickoff Dinner was held on Wednesday night, August 13. Approximately 65 folks joined together for a delicious catered meal!
